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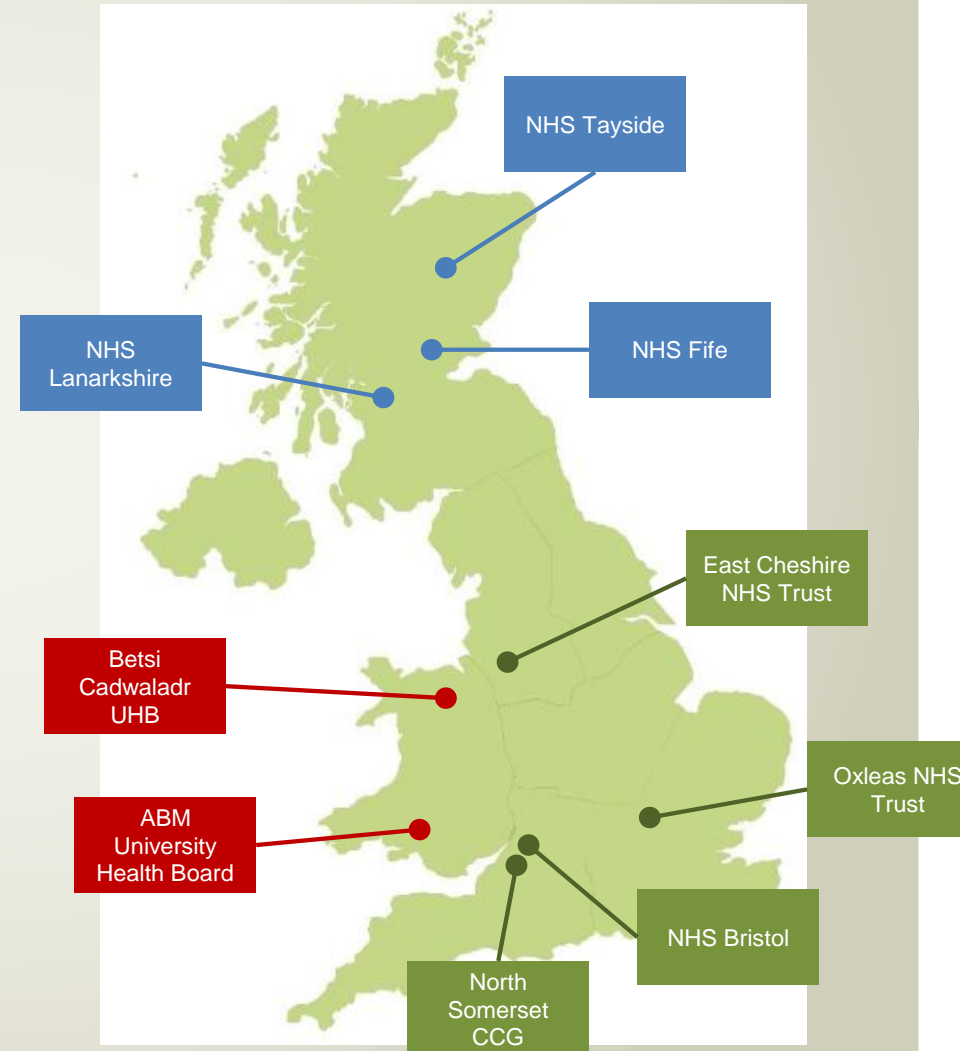

- AF register: 1.4%



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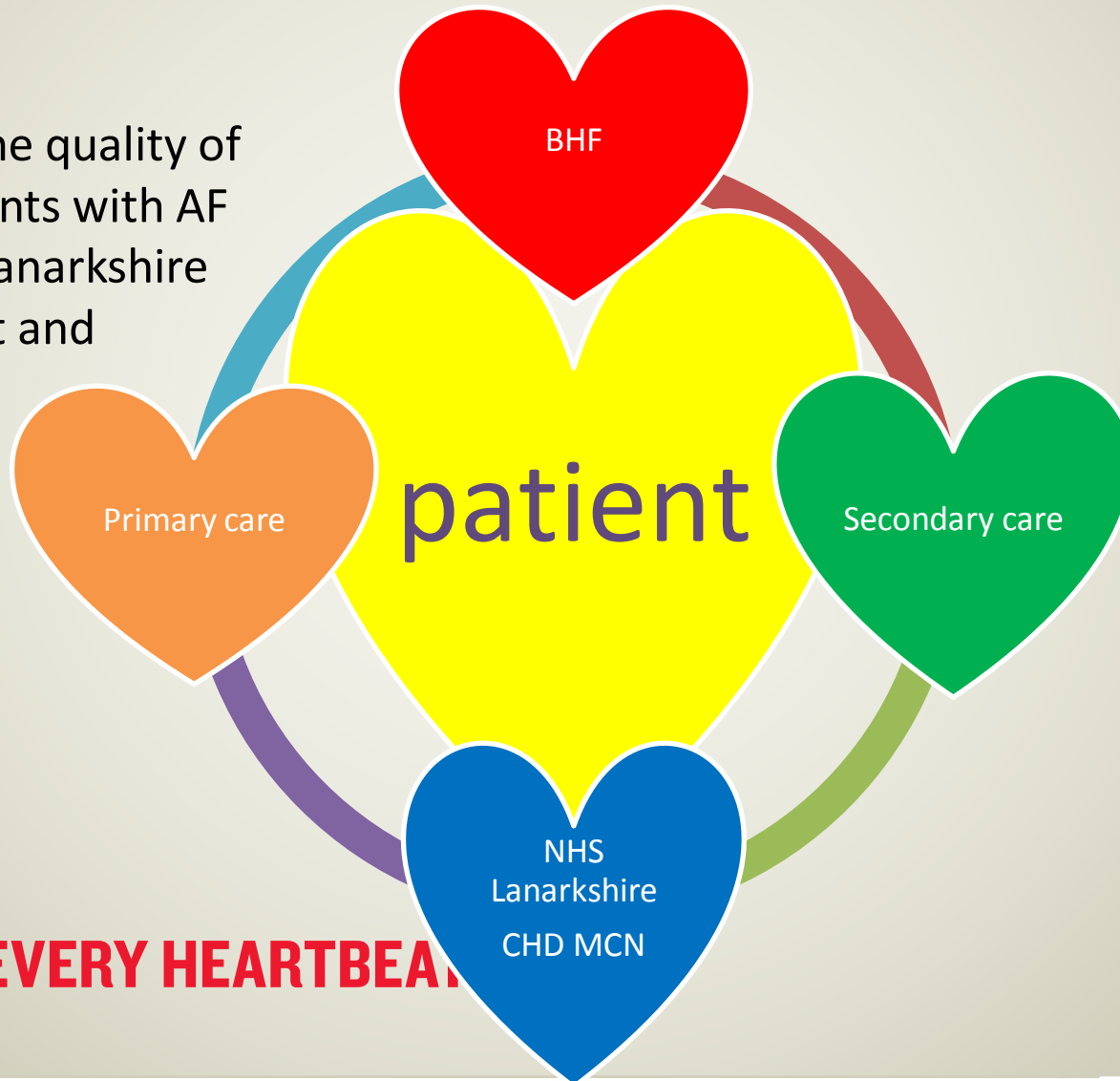
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Atrial Fibrillation Project

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Primary Care Timeline



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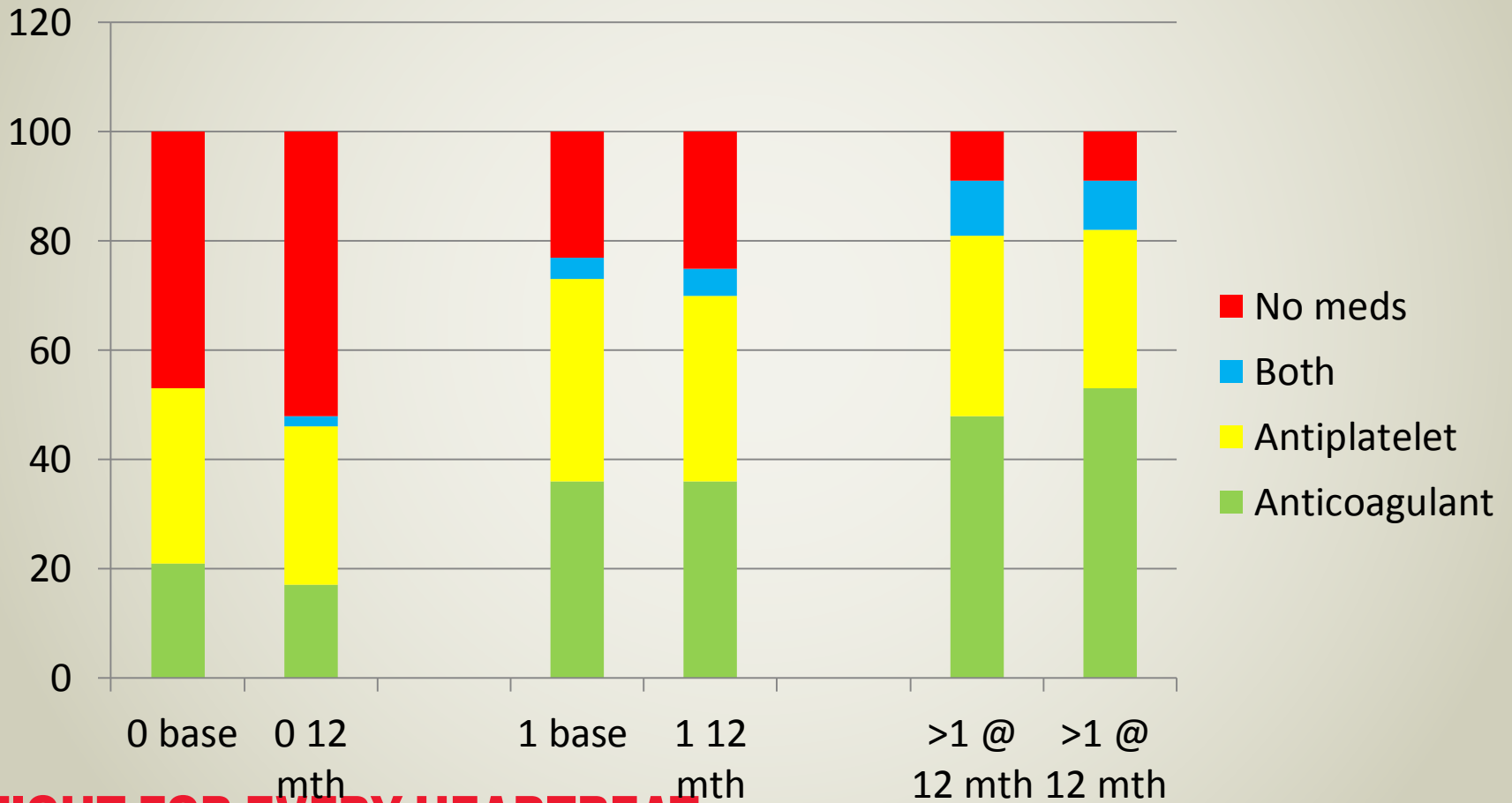
Focused “Lists”

1. CHA_2DS_2 $VASc > 1$: currently not on anticoagulant
2. CHA_2DS_2 $VASc = 1$: male only: not on anticoagulant
3. CHA_2DS_2 $VASc = 0$: on either antiplatelet or anticoagulant
4. All those on both antiplatelet and anticoagulant
5. AF resolved status
